



#### **DELEGATE INFORMATION & RESPONSIBILITIES**

#### **DELEGATE INFORMATION**

Delegates are representatives who attend Conference and vote in the interest of their clubs. Each club sends three delegates, one of whom is the club's president.

Delegates should have a working knowledge of Soroptimist Laws, region and parliamentary procedures, and the objectives and ideals of the organization.

#### **DELGATE RESPONSIBILITIES**

#### **During Conference**

- Register at Conference upon arrival.
- Attend and be on time for all sessions.
- Be familiar with the Conference Standing Rules.
- Participate in discussion and debate.
- Write down important business proceedings and back ground information to report to your club.
- Vote per your club's instruction. If not instructed, use your best judgment considering the best interests of your and all of the region's clubs.
- Be willing to accept an assignment from the Governor, if asked.
- Complete the evaluation form before leaving.
- Have a GREAT time!

#### **After Conference**

- Prepare a report as instructed by the club president.
   Consider the following outline:
  - Action by Conference regarding the changes in the governing documents, the budget or other matters to the voting body and the reason for each action.
  - Summary of proposals not approved by the Conference and the reason for disapproval.
  - Ideas for increasing club interest and support in attaining Soroptimist goals.
  - Summary of the workshops and committee presentations.
  - Summary of the other presentations.
  - Awards: who won them and why. Hints for helping your club win next year.
  - Your personal evaluation of the Conference.



#### **CONFERENCE STANDING RULES**

#### **VOTING BODY:**

The voting body of the Conference shall be the Sierra Nevada Region Board of Directors and the three accredited delegates of each club in good standing. A club is in good standing if all requirements of Soroptimist bylaws and procedures are met.

#### **REGISTRATION:**

All persons attending Conference sessions shall be registered and shall wear their registration badges at all official functions.

#### **CREDENTIALS:**

Delegates shall wear their delegate badge at all meetings and during business sessions. All delegates shall be seated in the section reserved for voting delegates.

If an emergency requires that an alternate be certified as the delegate, both the delegate and the alternate shall report to the Credentials desk and sign the registration sheet. If the delegate is not available, a letter from the club can designate the alternate as the official delegate to Conference. Once certified as the delegate, she shall serve as the delegate for the remainder of the Conference. All applicable items relating to the delegate position shall be transferred to the alternate.

#### **DECORUM:**

Delegates shall be seated before the sessions are called to order.

A delegate or other member who wishes to speak shall rise, address the presiding officer and having been recognized, shall state her name and the name of her club.

During business meetings, members are requested to refrain from speaking unless entitled to the floor and to suppress unnecessary noise in the meeting room and the corridors adjoining it.

Ringers on cell phones shall not be allowed during business sessions, workshops or meals.

#### **MOTIONS:**

Each motion shall be submitted in writing to the Region Secretary at the time it is made. ONLY ACCREDITED DELEGATES MAY MAKE MOTIONS AND VOTE. Motion forms will be available on the delegates' tables.

#### **DEBATE:**

Any Soroptimist may ask her questions and take part in debate, but precedence shall be given to delegates.

During a debate, a member may speak for two minutes and once only to a question, unless no other member wants the floor and consent to speak twice is granted by the voting body.

#### **ORDERS OF THE DAY:**

The official Conference program shall constitute the Orders of the Day.

#### **REPORTS:**

A written copy of each report shall be handed to the Region Secretary at the time the report is presented to the Conference body.

#### **MINUTES:**

The Region Governor shall appoint a committee of three delegates to approve the Conference Minutes.

#### **SUSPENSION:**

These rules may be suspended by a two-thirds vote of the delegates.

#### **PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE:**

Where not inconsistent with the Soroptimist laws, Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern.

## Julie Debbs Nominated by SI Citrus Heights

Julie Debbs is a determined woman who is not only a survivor of Human Sex Trafficking, but also a mentor, community activist, educator and volunteer who assists women and

girls involved in the sex trade on a daily basis. She is currently volunteering her time and support as Operations Director for Sex Workers Outreach Project (SWOP) in Sacramento, which uses a peer-based, harm reduction model to connect with women/girls "where they are" on the street level or on-line level. Debbs and her story have appeared in News and Review, Capital Public Radio's nation -wide radio program "Story Corps," Fox 40 News in Sacramento. In 2009, Oprah Winfrey named her an Ambassador of Hope.

"Through my public outreach I have been able to educate people about the fact that there wouldn't be the demand for sex workers if there weren't men willing to purchase and consume these services that exploit women. I have been successful in educating men about this complicated and sensitive issue," says Debbs.

Her commitment and unwavering passion to inspire hope in the lives of sex trafficking victims have led her to produce a documentary called "Off Track". Currently enrolled at California State University, Sacramento, she has received the William Randolph Hearst Scholarship for Outstanding Achievement while pursuing a Bachelor's Degree in Social Work.

#### YOUTH CLUB AWARDS



#### S Club Award

The S Club award is presented to outstanding middle or high school S Clubs in the Sierra Nevada Region that have made significant contributions of service to their school and community.

Soroptimists know that young adults are our most precious resource, and we are committed to encouraging "excellence in youth."

1st Place: Quincy High School S Club - SI Quincy



Quincy High School S Club organized a Thanksgiving Feast for the community which included students from the local community college who were unable to go home for the holiday, many single mothers and their children and those who could not afford to purchase all the trimmings for a holiday feast. The Club decided on a date and secured a place to hold the event. They prepared flyers to distribute in the community advertising the event. It was quite a project as they created decorations, requested donations, did fundraising, advertised, prepared food, served the food and cleaned up!

These students did it all!! This project was started in 2010 and has been an annual event for the Quincy S Club, serving over 100-150 people each year.

Of course they didn't stop there. Other projects are Pennies of PDH, a penny/coin collection given to Plumas District Hospital; Quincy Elementary School Fall Feast; United Blood Services; Stockings for Preschoolers; childcare for parents during school meetings with teachers; Earth Day Campus Clean-up; Safe Trick or Treat. The club also had motivational speakers.

This Club is what S Club is all about—Leadership, Friendship and Service.

#### 2nd Place:

Inspiro School of Art and Science - SI Bidwell Rancho

This S Club invited a speaker from the "6<sup>th</sup> Street Center For Youth" to learn how they could help. They decided on a project to provide socks and underwear which is the two most needed items for the shelter. They worked on advertising at their school, making flyers and then taking the items to the shelter. Other projects were having a speaker from the local domestic shelter speak at the entire school; a speaker from the Chico Community Food Locker on hunger in the community; painted rocks with positive saying and putting them in places around the school; and made posters for Suicide Prevention month.

#### 3rd Place:

Burney High School S Club - SI Burney/Fall River

Burney S Club collaborated and decided to raise funds to send to the victims of the Houston hurricane. Other projects were Girls On the Run which helps build confidence, self esteem, team work and independence for girls 3-8<sup>th</sup> grade; Diaper Drive, delivered to Potter's Hand teen pregnancy center; worked booth at Heritage days; and community clean-up.

#### Honorable Mention: Sierra High School S Club - SI Truckee Donner

The majority of students are at-risk girls. This S Club won the award last year and is continuing with several projects. They created a food closet for any student who needs food; have guest speakers on careers, life and social skills; and have used some parts of the Dream It Be It program.

#### LIVE YOUR DREAM AWARDS

#### **Education and Training Award for Women**

The Soroptimist Live Your Dream Awards assist women who provide the primary source of financial support for their families by giving them the resources they need to improve their education, skills and employment prospects. Eligible applicants must be enrolled in, or have been accepted to, a vocational/skills training program or an undergraduate degree program and must demonstrate financial need.

The Award involves three levels of cash awards. The program begins at the local Soroptimist club-level, where award amounts vary. Local-level award recipients become eligible for region-level awards of either \$3,000 or \$5,000. The top Region level award recipient then becomes eligible for awards at the Federation level \$10,000.




**Hadiya A. Brown**Submitted by SI South Placer




